201% Accelerated Programs Financial Aid Fact Sheet

Investing in education makes great financial sense. The sooner you complete your education, the more quickly you will see the benefits of having invested the time and effort to be successful in college. That's what makes the Public Safety Management, Organization Management and Management Information Systems accelerated programs at Calumet College of St. Joseph so attractive - you can finish your Bachelor Degree in as little as 18 months. Your bachelor degree will then give greater opportunities for increased earning potential.

To make your college education successful, the Calumet College of St. Joseph Office of Financial Aid will help you find an effective means of managing your resources. The information on this Financial Aid Fact Sheet will give you a summary of grant, scholarship and loan opportunities available to you as an adult student. As a transfer student, you are probably familiar with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) process. We would like to offer just a few quick facts: FAFSA online is found at www.fafsa.ed.gov; the financial aid code for Calumet College of St. Joseph is 001834; for residents of Indiana, the FAFSA must be received by federal processors by March 10 for full consideration of all state grants and scholarships.

Federal Aid Information

Federal Pell Grant - is a need based award for undergraduate students to help meet the cost of their higher education. It does not require repayment.

Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) - provides additional assistance to a limited number of undergraduate students with exceptional financial need. It does not require repayment.

Federal Family Education Loan Program - Subsidized and Unsubsidized - After your eligibility for other types of financial assistance has been determined, you may need to borrow a Federal Stafford Loan to pay for any remaining costs of education. The U.S. Department of Education pays the interest on the Subsidized loan while you are in attendance at least half time. Students are responsible for payment on the interest of an Unsubsidized loan, which could be deferred and capitalized.

Federal Work Study - provides jobs for undergraduate and graduate students who need financial aid. Earnings are determined by the Office of Financial Aid. The job may be off-campus or in a public or private non-profit organization.

State Aid Information

The State of Indiana Frank O'Bannon Grants and Scholarships

Higher Education Award (HEA) - is available to residents with demonstrated financial need who have submitted their FAFSA so that it is received by the state of Indiana by the March filing deadline. The HEA can be used only to pay tuition.

Freedom of Choice (FOC) - has the same requirements as the HEA and is only available at private colleges.

Part-Time Grant - is available to eligible residents of Indiana that are enrolled in at least an Associates Degree program consisting of 3-11 credit hours per semester.

Associated Degree Grant	Award amount up to \$2,000	Completion of Associate Degree at a regionally accredited college. Enrollment at CCSJ within 12 months of earning a degree.	Admission to the College

Accelerated Program Scholarships are awarded based on the above criteria, but are limited in number and granted on a first come, first served basis. Award amounts are based on credit hours of enrollment.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition for all Accelerated Program classes include books costs. Payment plans are also available. A typical semester for an Organization management (OMN) or Management Information Systems (MIS) student consists of three classes of three credit hours each.
