RESOURCE HIGHLIGHT: THE ENCYCLOPEDIA OF PSYCHOLOGY (PSYCHOLOGY.ORG/RESOURCES/)



The "Encyclopedia of Psychology" is a free online directory of over one thousand seven hundred websites relating to different aspects of psychology. Organized into eight categories, the website includes links to web resources discussing important people, different types of research (cognitive, clinical, etc.), as well as various relevant organizations.
