## DR. CHEN'S VISIT TO CHINA

Last month, Dr. Chen visited China, where she led a delegation of librarians' part of the Chinese American Librarians Association in presenting at the Library Society of China Annual Conference, held from October 25th to the 27th. As a distinguished guest, Dr. Chen delivered a keynote speech on "Applying Learner-Centered pedagogy in Library Instruction and Reference Services: an Individualized Approach." All of the presentations were well received, with over 200 people in attendance. In addition to her presentation, Dr. Chen also visited libraries in Beijing, Xian, Shanghai and Tongling, and met with her counterparts at Beijing Normal University and at Beijing People's University, establishing agreements to setup training programs for members of the Chinese American Librarians Association.
